Look at Neil Gaiman's sentences describing winter:

"Winter hung in there, like an invalid refusing to die. Day after grey day the ice stayed hard, the world remained unfriendly and cold."

Word Collecting: collect vocabulary and ideas to describe a forest in winter.



Simile: which aspects of a forest in winter could be described with a simile?

Frozen branches Icicles

Initiate Model Enable

Describe what Odd sees as he opens the door; this is the wide view – don't focus on the fox's appearance yet, we'll do this in the second sentence.



Odd opened the hut door and scanned the darkness before him: he could just make out the blurred outline of tree after tree and mounds of heaped snow and there, right before him, was a creature, as still as an ice sculpture, sitting upright with its ears pricked.

Odd opens the hut's door and sees a fox, sitting in the snow watching him.

Write about the night scene outside the hut.

Look at Neil Gaiman's sentence describing the fox:

"Its muzzle was narrow, its ears were pricked and sharp, and its expression was calculating and sly."

Collect words about the parts of the fox you could describe:

Ears

Muzzle

Teeth Whiskers

Tail

Feet

Fur Eyes

Facial expression.

Look at the structure of Neil Gaiman's sentence – it uses five adjectives, sometimes in pairs: "Its muzzle was narrow, its ears were pricked and sharp, and its expression was calculating and sly."

I'm going to model this with a sentence about Odd so that I don't steal all the ideas for the fox!

Odd was an unusual boy: his leg was limp, his hair was bright red and tangled, and his eyes were intelligent and mischievous. Write a sentence about the fox.

Use a simile to describe the fox. Here's how Neil Gaiman did it:

"It was red-orange, like flame, and it took a dancing step or two towards Odd, and turned away, then looked back at Odd as if it were inviting him to follow."


Focus on action – how it moves: Dancing
