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Make a Penguin



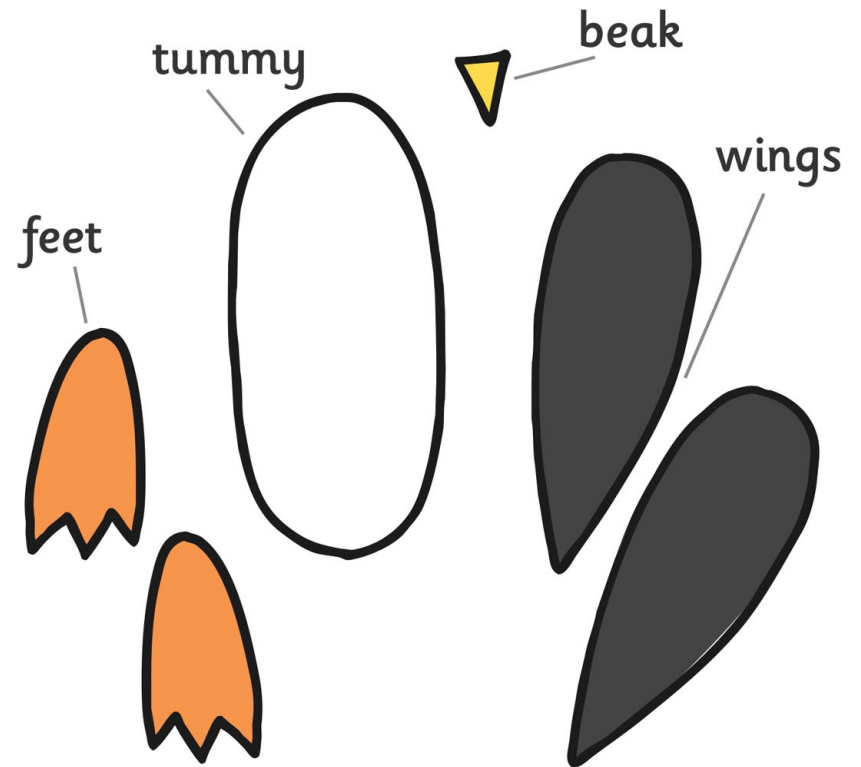
You will need:

Glue some black paper to the outside of the cardboard tube.



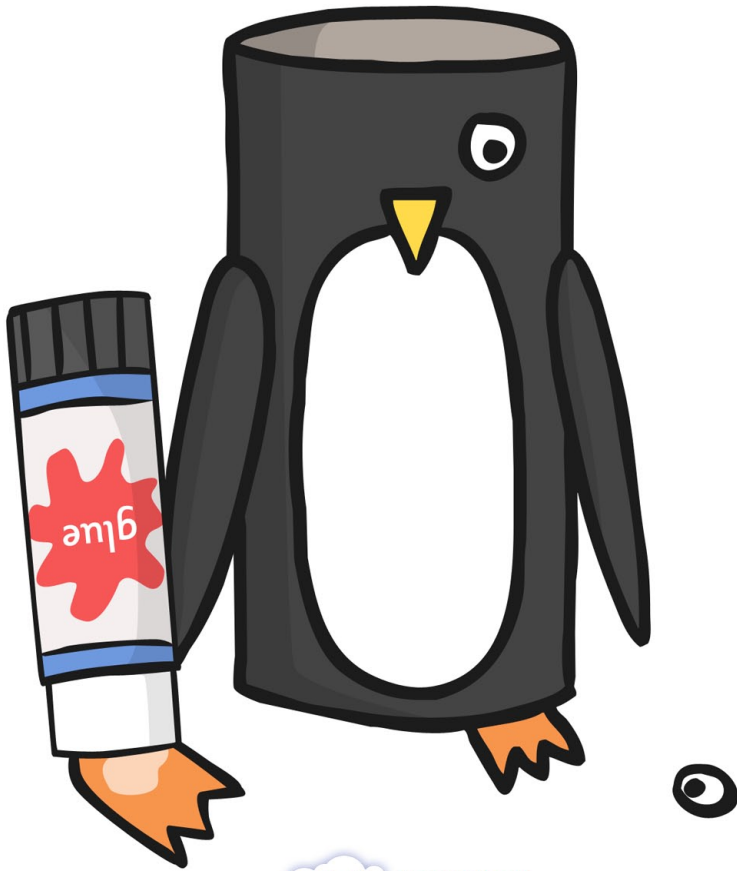
