

Elmer in the Snow

MONDAY:

Phonics – 1) Recall all Phase 2 phonemes and last week's Phase 3 phonemes. Your child should be able to give you the sound for each of these graphemes: s, a, t, p, i, n, m, d, g, o, c, k, ck, e, u, r, h, b, f, ff, l, ll, and j, v, w, x, y, z, zz, qu, sh, ch, th, ng, ai, ee, oo, oo, oa, ar, or. Practice reading the Phase 2 tricky words: I, to, no, go, into, the and Phase 3 high frequency words: he, she, we, me, be, was, my, you, her, they, all, are, for, too, this, that (tricky words cannot be sounded out, they must be read by sight. The easiest way to practise these is to make flash cards – 1 word on each piece pf paper)
2) Introduce next phoneme: igh

3) Can your child find the phonemes for high, sigh, light, night? (use the phoneme mats for Phase 2 and 3 and point to the graphemes, or have the phonemes on pieces of paper or even toys for your child to manipulate into position.

4) Can your child read/sound out these words: tight, might, right, sight?



5) Read this sentence aloud for your child to write, referring to the phase 2 and 3 sound mats if needed. The night is not light.

Write Stuff – Read the first page/Watch first page of Elmer in the Snow. Then encourage your child to talk about how the group of elephants were feeling. Think of ideas for the missing word in the sentence below (It is a 'feeling' fantastic). Choose your favourite and write it down.



The group of elephants felt _______. (unhappy, sad, upset, grumpy, etc) *Now read your sentence aloud together.*

Now listen to the *next few pages (up to 1:40) up to and including, 'The elephants roared with laughter as they played in the snow.* Discuss what kinds of playing they enjoy doing in the snow and think of some other words to described what they elephants did. Get them to write down the missing words in this 'action' sentence:



The elephants roared with laughter as they _____ (played, rolled, stamped, etc.) together. *Now read your sentence aloud together.*

Maths – This week we will continue with the lessons from Oak National Academy on numbers within 20.

Lesson 1 – In this lesson you will count up to 20 objects and look at the order of numbers to 20 on a number line. You will need: counting objects (like little discs or tiny cubed lego or pencils) and a 0-20 number line (see PDF)

TUESDAY:

Phonics – 1) Recall all Phase 2 phonemes and last week's Phase 3 phonemes. Your child should be able to give you the sound for each of these graphemes: s, a, t, p, i, n, m, d, g, o, c, k, ck, e, u, r, h, b, f, ff, l, ll, and j, v, w, x, y, z, zz, qu, sh, ch, th, ng, ai, ee, oo, oo, oa, ar, or, igh. Practice reading the Phase 2 tricky words: I, to, no, go, into, the and Phase 3 high frequency words: he, she, we, me, be, was, my, you, her, they, all, are, for, too, this, that (tricky words cannot be sounded out, they must be read by sight. The easiest way to practise these is to make flash cards – 1 word on each piece pf paper)
2) Introduce next phoneme: ur. Talk about words that have ur. Join Mr Mc for 'Flying with Phonics':

- 3) Can your child find the phonemes for fur, burn, burp, curl?
- 4) Can your child read/sound out these words: surf, urn, hurt, turn?
- 5) Read this sentence aloud for your child to write (no copying!) Do not burn the turnip.

Write Stuff – Read up to and including, 'Soon the elephants were slipping and sliding and crashing and falling (*to 2:12*). Then encourage your child to talk about a variety of synonyms for and think of the missing words for the 'action' sentence below.



Soon the elephants were______. (slipping and sliding, crashing and falling, rolling and tumbling, etc) *Now read your sentence aloud together*.

Read up unit, 'Then he touched the white elephant and a piece fell off (to 2:47). Find some words that will fit into this 'noticing' sentence:



Then he touched the white elephant and _____ (a piece fell off, it cracked, it crumbled, it broke). *Now read your sentence aloud together.*

- 5) Read this sentence aloud for your child to write (no copying!) That cow is big and brown.

Write Stuff – Read up to and including "I know where Elmer is," chuckled another. (to 2:55) Then encourage your child to talk about a variety of synonyms for chuckled. Think of the missing words for the 'speaking' sentence below.



"I know where Elmer is," _____ (chuckled, laughed, giggled, etc) another. *Now read your sentence aloud together.*

Read to the end of the story. Find some words for this 'feeling' sentence that describe how Elmer is feeling.

Elmer felt _____ (happy, pleased, etc). *Now read your sentence aloud together.*

Maths – Lesson3 – In this lesson you will sort your objects and compare the groups of objects. You will need 10 small objects and 2 containers.

Practice reading the Phase 2 tricky words: I, to, no, go, into, the and Phase 3 high frequency words: he, she, we, me, be, was, my, you, her, they, all, are, for, too, this, that (tricky words cannot be sounded out, they must be read by sight. The easiest way to practise these is to make flash cards – 1 word on each piece pf paper)

Maths - **Lesson 4** – In this lesson, we are going to explore place value using objects. You will use a tens frame to place objects and to help count them. You will need 20 objects for counting (2 sets of 10 objects) and number cards up to 10 and 2 tens frame (see PDF)
