1:30 – 2:30	<p>Geography – Tourism in a Mountain Area</p> <p>People like to visit areas with mountains as they usually provide beautiful scenery and the opportunity to challenge yourself to climb the mountain and see the views from the peak. Today we are going to consider whether this kind of tourism is always a good thing. We will explore the different opinions of people who may live or work in mountain areas.</p> <p>California has many mountain ranges – the Sierra Nevada range is famous for its ski resorts. The UK also has mountains our highest being Ben Nevis in Scotland and there are ski resorts in the Scottish Highlands. However, today we will visit the Lake District and look at tourism there.</p> <p>Watch the first 8 minutes of The Travel Show https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=FoD4YaYqE-E</p> <p>You will see how a group called Fix the Fells are looking after areas of the Lake District. You need to refer back to the text to answer the questions, using your scanning skills and taking note of any sub-headings which might direct you to the answers. Always read the entire text first, before attempting any of the questions.</p> <p>MARK Mark your work using the mark scheme. If you don't understand why you got a question wrong, email your teacher for some help.</p>
