


What is a suffix? Click on the right answer.

If a suffix **starts with** a consonant letter, it is usually added straight on without changing the root word.

+ment

plainness

+ness

+ful

Look at these spellings and decide if they follow this rule or not.

Let's check! Click on each word.

enjoyment
Yes! The suffix is added straight on to the root word: enjoy+ment

Sadness
Yes! The suffix is added straight on to the root word: sad+ness

careful
Yes! The suffix is added straight on to the root word: care+ful

playful
Yes! The suffix is added straight on to the root word: play+ful

Yes! The suffix is added straight on to the root word: plain+**n**ess

There is an exception to this rule.



To add **-ment** to the word 'argue', you must remove the 'e' before adding the suffix.

argue + ment — argument — argument

Look carefully at these spellings. The root words all have more than one syllable and end in a -y with a consonant before it.

Root word Suffix

merry + ment = merriment

happy + ness = happiness

plent**y** + ful = plentiful

Can you and your friend think of a rule for adding a suffix to a word that has more than 2 syllables and ends in -y with a consonant before it?



If a word has more than 2 syllables and ends in -y . . .

. . . change the **-y** to '**i'** and add the suffix.
