


Consonants are letters (or sounds) that are not vowels (a, e, i, o, u). For example j, d and z are all consonants.




Play the odd one out activity.

As a class use 'an' or 'a' to find the odd one out.






With your partner use 'an' or 'a' to find the odd one out.






Can you write a rule about using 'an' or 'a' on a whiteboard?



Your rule about using 'an' or 'a' should sound like this:

Use 'an' before a word that starts with a vowel sound.

For example:



an <u>e</u>lephant



an <u>u</u>mbrella

an <u>h</u>our — 'hour' does not start with a vowel (a, e, i, o or u) but it does start with a vowel sound.



an h<u>ou</u>r because the 'h' is silent. Tricky!
