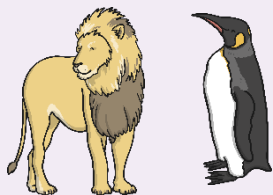

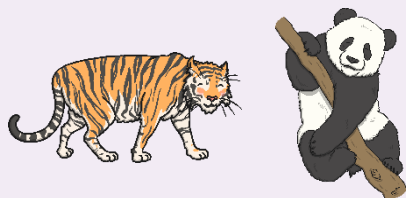
Can you complete the sentences to describe what each child saw at the zoo?  
Remember to use the word **and** to join the two animals together.



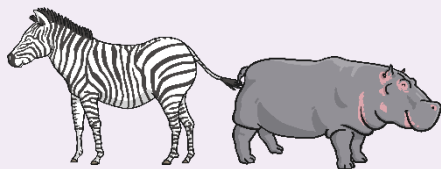

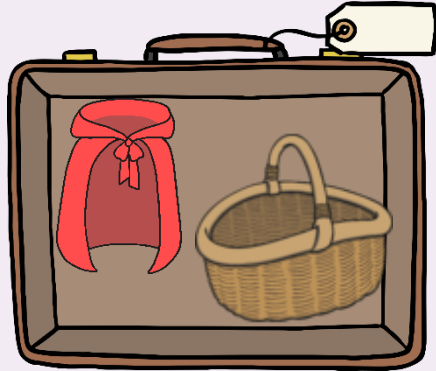

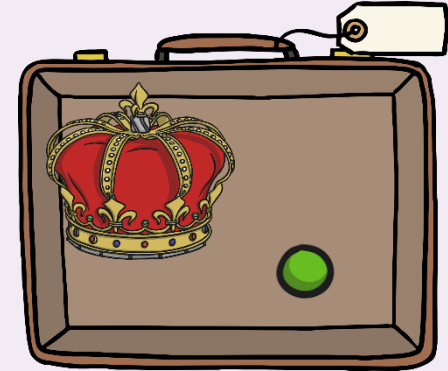


Can you write a sentence to describe what each of these characters have in their suitcases using the word **and** to join the parts of your sentence together?



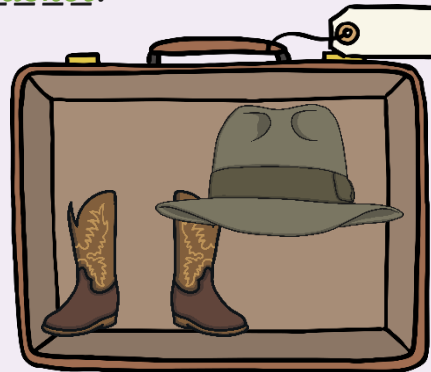

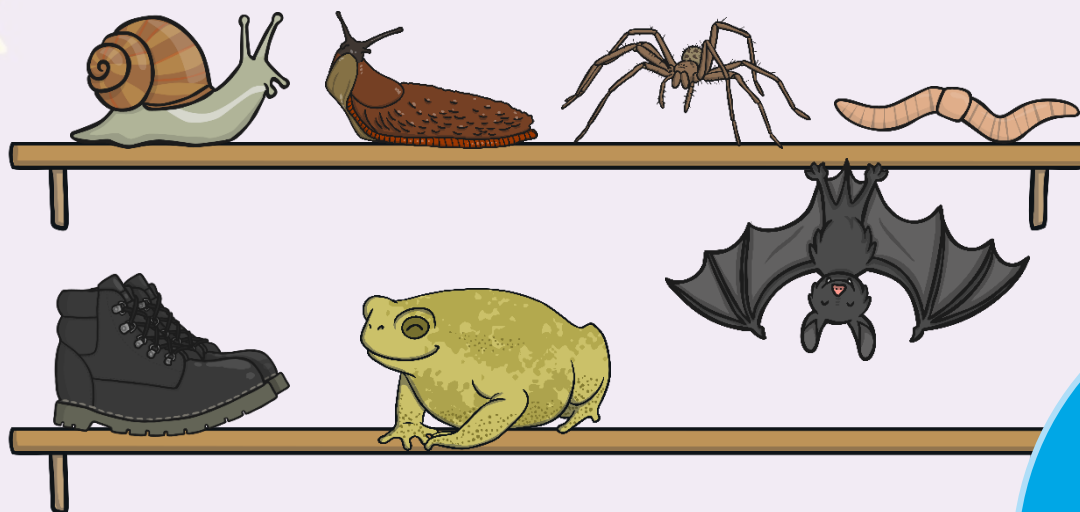
You are allowed to buy two things from the toy shop. Write a sentence to say which two things you want to buy, using the word **and** to join the different parts of your sentence.

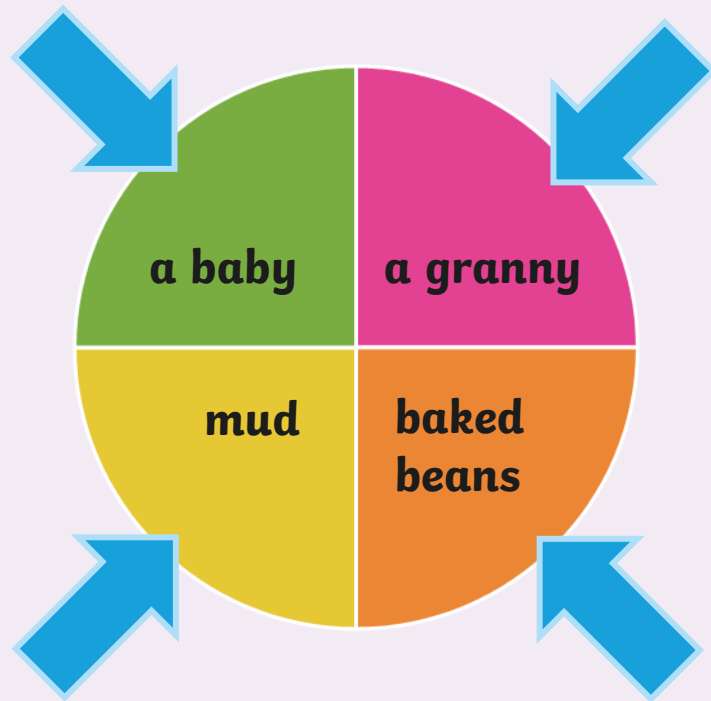
