# Experience Title Town Planners

Rationale: During this experience pupils will develop key geographical skills through the study of their local environment. They will undertake fieldwork in Borough Green and collect, interpret and present information in a variety of ways, making cross-curricular links with mathematics. Children will learn about Borough Green's place within the United Kingdom, Europe and the world. The children will learn how to use an atlas. Children will develop their use of key geographical vocabulary through a range of practical group activities.

In this experience, they will make a leaflet that will describe the key features of Borough Green. This will encourage children to think about human geography, and to consider how the land in their local area is used.

Pupils will listen to, share and discuss a high-quality book with the teacher, other adults and each other to engender a love of reading at the same time as they are reading independently. Pupils' vocabulary will develop and feed into their writing. Through listening, pupils will also start to learn how language sounds and increase their vocabulary and awareness of grammatical structures. In due course, they will be able to draw on such grammar in their own writing.

Prior Learning: Children will have some experience of walking through the local area perhaps on their way to school. They will be familiar with the local shops and some places of interest such as the library.
