## What can be done to reduce racism in modern Britain? Can religion help?

racism	When people are treated unfairly because of their skin colour or background
prejudice	Unfriendly feelings, injury or damage directed against an individual, group, or race without good reason.
discrimination	Unfair treatment of one particular person or group of people. Usually because of the person's sex, religion, nationality, ethnicity (culture), race, or other personal traits.
tolerance	Sympathy for or acceptance of feelings, habits, or beliefs that are different from one's own.
harmony	To live together in a group with respect and understanding of others
refugee	A person who flees for safety, especially from a foreign country.

We will learn about some aspects of World War II:


The Blitz: was a German bombing campaign against the United Kingdom in 1940 and 1941, during the Second World War.

**Air Raid Shelters:** also known as bomb shelters, were structures for protection against enemy attacks from the air. People built private ones in their gardens or houses but there were also public communal ones in the Underground in London.

**Kindertransport** (German for "children's transport") was an organised rescue effort that took place during the nine months prior to the outbreak of the Second World War. The United Kingdom took in nearly 10,000, predominantly Jewish children from Nazi Germany and other Nazi-occupied countries.

**Evacuation:** children and vulnerable adults living in places likely to be bombed were moved to safer areas of the United Kingdom.

**Kristallnacht:** means 'Night of Broken Glass'. On 9-10<sup>th</sup> November 1938, Nazis in Germany set fire to synagogues and vandalised Jewish homes, businesses and schools. 100 Jews were killed.
