What have the children been up to this week? KS2 this week...

Last Friday, Year 3 and 4 began their Through the Ages experience with a Prehistoric Day. They explored soap knapping, Stone Age clothes and handled prehistoric artefacts. In the afternoon, they had a go at den building and cave painting. Thank you to parents and carers for helping the children to look fantastic in their prehistoric outfits they arrived in.



Term I has seen the start of our Dynamic Dynasties topic in Years 5 & 6. The children have already got hands-on creating Shang Oracle Bones out of clay (based on lamb scapulas kindly donated by Kent County Butchers on Western Road). We have also been exploring poetry in our writing, describing a traditional Chinese garden through metaphor, simile and other literary techniques. In science and DT, we have started to look at forces and have created simple pneumatic mechanisms in the classroom. Please do ask your children to share their learning with you – they are incredible at absorbing and explaining all that we are up to.
