## World Book Day......


World Book Day 2024

World Book Day is on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March this year and we have lote of exciting things planned in school. We would like to continue the idea from last year for dressing up with the children coming in dressed up as a 'word'. They should not have the word written on them as they will be guessing what each other represents as part of one of their activities on the day. Some great ideas from last year included colours (children come in dressed in as one colour), adjectives such as 'cosy' (children coming in dressed in warm dressing gowns), sporty (wearing sports clothes) or coming in dressed as a particular animal. Please do not feel you need to buy outfits for the children - they can just use what they have at home!

#### **TT ROCKSTARS**


On Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> February, Borough Green took part in the NSPCC Rocks times table challenge.

277,522 children played in total, including 124 BGPS students, who helped us to come in 1,161 out of 3,793 schools nationally – putting us in the top third of the league table!

Huge congratulations to all who played but especially to Sam (Oak), Teddy (Sycamore), Ryan (Sycamore), Artie (Oak) and Joe (Maple), who clocked up over 1,000 points each, and to Archie (Maple) who scored more than 5,000 points.

#### **COMPUTING**





This week at Borough Green Primary School, we have been raising awareness about 'Online Safety' and 'Internet Safety'. From EYFS to Year 6, we want to encourage children to get talking about positive and negative online experiences to help educate our young people about online life. These conversations are great for children to have a better understanding of the online world. The theme this year for 'Safer Internet Day' is about changes online.

In EYFS, we have been busy using iPads and being more digitally literate with apps and photos, as well as listening to diverse stories including technology.

In Year 1/2, we have been looking at 'What is a computer?' This is where we understand what is meant by a computer, a program and starting to look at coding based on instructions (also known as algorithms). We have been using computers to develop our digital literacy as well as our computer science skills.

In Year 3/4, our topic this half term has been about 'My Online Life'. We have had discussions about being a good digital citizen and what this means, including being kind online and what is meant by cyber bullying. With this awareness, we hope the children can understand the importance of staying safe online.

In Year 5/6 we have focussed on coding and programming physical computing kits called 'Micro:bits'. Using online software on the laptops, the children have programmed these miniature computers to perform actions in the real world after using the online simulator.

#### What can I do to support my child at home?

Children can explore programming skills ready for physical computing (where they input an action using code which will create an output in the real world using a 'Micro:bit'). It is free to use and fun to explore. <a href="https://makecode.microbit.org/">https://makecode.microbit.org/</a>

#### CRICKET

Over this past term, Sandra Hepple, Community Cricket Coach with Kent Cricket, has been delivering cricket sessions to year 2 and year 3/4 through a charity called <u>Chance to Shine</u>. Chance to Shine aims to give all children the opportunity to play, learn and develop through cricket. The response of the children was overwhelmingly positive so we will look for more opportunities to develop our cricket skills as the weather improves!













### DT



This week in Year 5/6 we have been improving and practising our kitchen skills to make a seasonal soup. During the day, we peeled the potato and carrot. Then we chopped the potato into bite-sized pieces and sliced leek. Then we grated the carrot. Finally we added a vegetable stock cube. Then we were tasked with making the soup at home – as the main task in lesson was kitchen and knife skills. We thoroughly enjoyed making our soup kits! **Reception:** Mastering Maths at Home Workshop on Thursday, 22<sup>nd</sup> February, 2:30pm

Apple and Lime class have been using the Mastering Number scheme since September and the children are developing great number sense as a result of this. Mastering Number aims to secure firm foundations in the development of good number sense for all children from Reception through to Year 1 and Year 2. The aim over time is that children will leave KS1 with fluency in calculation and a confidence and flexibility with number that will benefit their maths throughout their education and beyond. We would like to invite every EYFS child to bring an adult into school to learn more about Mastering Number and how it can be used at home to support their learning. The workshop will take place in the school hall and will be attended by all Apple and Lime children.
