## A window into school life...

## Science:

To celebrate this week's Science Week 2024, the school has taken on a Curly Wurly Challenge! Children worked in groups to see how far they could stretch a Curly Wurly (toffee chocolate) bar in 3 minutes. They were aiming to beat the current world record, set by Tracy Sullivan in 2015, of 4.26 metres. We did not quite manage that but some very impressive - and sticky - attempts were made: notably, $102.5 \mathrm{~cm}(1.03 \mathrm{~m})$ by the Curly Girlies of Maple Class.

Some materials behave differently according to their temperature. A Curly Wurly stretches better when it is warm because the molecules can spread wider apart, increasing the material's elasticity. When the chocolate and toffee are cold, their molecules are bonded tightly together, preventing it from stretching.
