Dear Parents and Carers,

Another week has simply flown by and it has been a hive of activity here at Borough Green Primary School. We continued our theme of determined minds in assembly on Tuesday and were inspired by the athlete Suzanna Hext. She has demonstrated resilience throughout her life and has represented Great Britain as a Paralympic swimmer and in equestrian. We hope to see her taking part in the summer Olympics. The children have been singing in good voice in their singing assemblies and are being challenged with harmonies and different parts. We thank Miss Armstrong for the time taken to prepare and lead these assemblies.

Across the school, it has been a pleasure to see the excitement and enthusiasm in the EYFS swimming lessons and the flying of the fish kites. In Year 1, the children demonstrated teamwork and confidence when partitioning 2-digit numbers, and in Year 2, they were finding thirds and thinking about the different manipulatives that could help. Years 3 and 4 have been writing their non-chronological reports about the life of a Roman soldier following their research last week. Finally, in Years 5 and 6, they have been writing persuasive letters in response to the 'suggestion of reduced break time'. The children wrote passionately and articulated their thoughts in well-written letters which were a delight to read.

Mrs Martin has been impressed with the home learning and contributions for the Friday achievement assembly. I enjoyed reading a book Abbie (in Year 2) had written about life in a Victorian School. She wrote about punishments including the cane and dunce hats-how things have changed!

Sadly, we are saying goodbye to Mr Wheeler, our site manager, today. We would like to thank him for his hard work during the last 9 years and wish him well in his new job.

Despite the colder days, we have managed some time out on the meadow. We hope to see some more of this over the next few weeks...




Reception: Our learning experience this term is called Splash. For our Stunning Start, Apple and Lime Class children each made a fish kite. They had great fun flying them on the field.

A window into school life...

Primary Languages - French

French is taught from years 3-6 at Borough Green using the fantastic resource, Language Angels. Learning a new language has many benefits, not least in broadening children's understanding of the world. Many of our children already know another language and that is celebrated here.

French at Borough Green is taught in a fun, interactive way, with songs and many opportunities for trying out their language skills in a relaxed setting. Each term the children focus on a different topic, for example, Pets, the Weather, At the Cafe, At School. They learn to use relevant vocabulary in phrases and whole sentences, building up from listening and speaking to reading and writing. Core language is recycled in each unit so that children become familiar with language and can adapt it to suit different topics.

By the time children leave at the end of Year 6, they will be ready to continue their journey in language-learning at secondary school. All skills learnt in French at Borough Green will be beneficial to learning ANY language in the future.

Please take the opportunity to ask your child what they are learning in French; to practise vocabulary with them; to talk about famous sports people or celebrities who speak multiple languages; and to look for opportunities to speak or listen to another language on holiday.

Awards this term...


