## Parent Code of Conduct

We use the term Parent to refer to anyone with parental responsibility for a pupil, and anyone caring for a child (including grandparents and child minders).

Ay Borough Green Primary School, we are committed to working in partnership with parents and carers to support their child's learning. We aim to create a safe, respectful and inclusive environment for pupils, staff and parents.

To help us to do this, we set clear expectations and guidelines for all members of our community. This includes pupils (through our behaviour policy), staff (through the staff code of conduct) and parents (through this code of conduct).

We request and expect parents and other visitors to:

- Respect the ethos, vision and values of our school
- Treat all members of the school community with respect, with regards to both communication and behaviour at any time
- Refrain from any behaviour or language which might be deemed to be aggressive, insulting or abusive, when on (or calling staff at) school premises

Where parental conduct falls short of our expectations, the school will respond in a proportional way. The final decision for how to respond to breaches of this code of conduct rests with the Headteacher.

*Please note that schools are private property\*. If it is felt that a parent's aggressive, abusive or insulting behaviour or language is a risk to pupils or staff (it is enough for a pupil or member of staff to feel threatened) then the 'implied licence' to come on to school premises can be withdrawn.*

\*Section 547 of the Education Act 2011 School premises are private property and parents have been granted permission from the school to be on school premises. However, in case of abuse or threats to staff, pupils or other parents, school may ban parents from entering school. It is also an offence under section 547 of the Education Act 2011 for any person (including a parent) to cause a nuisance or disturbance on school premises. The police may be called to assist in removing the person concerned.
